Compagnie Hervé KOUBI
*What the Day Owes to the Night***

**PEAK Performances Slated for January 17-18
Have Been Rescheduled to Tuesday, January 31
In the Kravis Center's Rinker Playhouse**

(West Palm Beach, FL – January 18, 2017) The **Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts** today announced a new performance date for **Compagnie Hervé KOUBI: *What the Day Owes to the Night***. Originally scheduled for January 17-18, the *PEAK* performance will now be presented on Tuesday, January 31, 7:30 pm, in the Kravis Center's Marshall E. Rinker, Sr. Playhouse.

Born and raised in France with Algerian roots, **Hervé Koubi** is being hailed as one of Europe's most distinctive choreographers. His company of 12 French-Algerian and West African male dancers makes its Florida debut with *What the Day Owes to the Night*, a stunning work resplendent with backflips, head spins and emotional intensity. Powerful imagery evocative of Orientalist paintings and the stone filigree of Islamic architecture accompanies the provocative performance.

This *PEAK* performance is made possible by a grant from the **MLDauray Arts Initiative in honor of Leonard and Sophie Davis**, and is made possible by the **New England Foundation for the Arts' National Dance Project**, with lead funding from the **Doris Duke Charitable Foundation** and **The Andrew W.
