**RAYMOND F. KRAVIS CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS ANNOUNCES TWO
NEW BOARD MEMBERS**

Longtime supporters Norma Klorfine and Bill Peterson to Serve Three-Year Terms

(WEST PALM BEACH, Fla.) – The Board of Directors of the Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts elected at their annual meeting on April 26, 2018, Norma Klorfine and Bill Peterson to the not-for-profit performing arts center’s Board of Directors for three-year terms. Barbara Evans Golden, Ph.D. and Garrison (Gary) duP. Lickle were also elected to the designation of Life Trustees, having served the maximum terms as directors.

Michael Bracci was re-elected Board Chairman and other officers elected for 2018-2019 are John Kessler, Vice Chair; Laurie Silvers, Vice Chair; Jeffrey Stoops, Treasurer and James Harpel, Secretary.

“The Kravis Center for the Performing Arts welcomes Norma Klorfine and Bill Peterson to the Board of Directors,” said Bracci. “Each new member has extensive non-profit Board experience, are active participants in the community and have been longtime Kravis Center supporters. With their passion for the arts, they will be exceptional assets to the Board and the overall success and future of the Kravis Center.”

Norma Klorfine, a resident of Singer Island, Florida and Seattle, Washington, attended Pennsylvania State University and worked in marketing and advertising. She is the Director of the Klorfine Foundation, whose mission is to collaborate with environmental, educational and medical research, and arts and cultural institutions through a venture philanthropy approach to funding. Originally from Philadelphia, Klorfine was President of the Women’s Committee of the Philadelphia Museum of Art and served on the Indian and Himalayan Art Curatorial Committee of the Museum. In New York, she was a docent at the Museum of Art and Design. In Washington, she was on the board of IslandWood, the Environmental Learning Center, the Bellevue Arts Museum and PRATT Fine Arts Center. She is currently on the board of the University of Washington Eye Institute. Ms. Klorfine is a Kravis Center Founder member, a member of the Helen K. Persson Society and serves on the Education Committee. She is married to Leonard Klorfine.

West Palm Beach resident Bill Peterson graduated from the University of Toledo and was commissioned an officer in the U. S. Army through R.O.T.C. He served two years active duty as lieutenant and five years active reserve duty as a captain. Peterson retired as Senior Vice

President of the Television Station Group of the E. W. Scripps Company. He was General Manager of Scripps-owned WPTV News Channel 5 and General Manager of WPEC-TV News Channel 12, both in West Palm Beach. While at WPEC-TV, he was concurrently President of its parent company, Photo Electronics Corporation. Currently, Mr. Peterson is Chairman of Adopt-A-Family of the Palm Beaches, which provides services for homeless families with children. He was a longtime board member of United Way of Palm Beach County and served on the Palm Beach County Business Development Board and the Economic Council. This will be Mr. Peterson's second term on the Kravis Center Board, having served from 2002 to 2004. He currently serves on the Kravis Center's Information Technology Committee. He is married to Kathleen Peterson, and they have two children.

The Kravis Center is a not-for-profit performing arts center whose mission is to enhance the quality of life in Palm Beach County by presenting a diverse schedule of national and international artists and companies of the highest quality, by offering comprehensive arts education programs - serving approximately 2.5 million schoolchildren since its inception, by providing a Palm Beach County home for local and regional arts organizations to showcase their work and by providing an economic catalyst and community leadership in West Palm Beach, supporting efforts to increase travel and tourism to Palm Beach County.
